OUR HISTORY


Founded by twenty enthusiastic photographers just after the war in 1946, 'Banbury and District Camera Club', as it was formally known, was established with what largely remain the same aims as today:

'To bring together those interested in photography and to help improve the standard of amateur photography in this area'.

In 2002, needing to find a permanent home to hold its meetings, the Club received a call from John Childs at Chenderit School, Middleton Cheney, inviting the Club to use their impressive facilities.

Since then, Banbury Camera Club, as it is now known, has made Chenderit its home welcoming the warm relationship that has built up between the Club and the School over the past fourteen years.

IMAGES OF BANBURY is a project with a legacy that we are very proud of. It is a very large collection of images dating back to the fifties creating a wonderful social history of the area.

We meet weekly from September to May on a Monday evening (7.30 – 10.00 pm) at Chenderit School, Archery Road, Middleton Cheney, Banbury, Oxfordshire OX17 2QR.

We have a club membership of 90 friendly and enthusiastic members who are happy to share their knowledge and skills in digital and film photography.

We are fortunate to benefit from the wonderful facilities at the school – a purpose-built Lecture Theatre with full projection facilities for guest speakers and competition evenings; The Michael Heseltine Gallery for our annual exhibition, and the use of the computer suite with PC and Mac computers with the latest software installed.

We are also fortunate to have the occasional use, during practical sessions, of the school's excellent darkroom facilities for developing film.

During the season we have a range of practical interest sessions, expert lectures and friendly competitions (each with an external judge). Competitions include colour and mono print and projected images, usually as open subjects.

In a typical year our programme includes: Print Appreciation; Photo Manipulation; Portraiture and Macro work; Basic Camera Skills; Audio Visual and the use of the Darkroom.

Talks have included Travelogues, Camera Techniques, Photo Restoration, The History of Photography and many more.

We also run summer photography activities locally and further afield.




